The Port Moody Public Library has ukuleles for loan! Borrow a kit that includes a soft protective bag, ukulele (Soprano or Concert), Hal Leonard Ukulele Method Book 1, and tuner.

How do I borrow a Ukulele Kit?

You can check out a ukulele kit with your library card from our Accounts desk.

You can borrow a kit for three weeks. Overdue kits are subject to a fine of \$0.35 per day. Kits may be renewed up to two times (as long as there are no other customers waiting).

Soprano versus Concert ukulele?

Soprano ukuleles are 21" and the most common and standard type of ukulele. They are known for their jangly sound and are good ukuleles for beginners or children.

Concert ukuleles are 23" and are a little bit bigger than Soprano ukuleles. Some consider them to have a fuller sound. They are a good option for adults with larger hands.
